TRAIL SAFETY & ETIQUETTE

Please follow these simple guidelines to keep the trail experience safe and pleasant for all users:

- Stay on the trail.
- Respect wildlife.
- Pick up litter.
- Don't cut switchbacks.

CYCLISTS:

- Yield to slower traffic.
- Stop your bike for equestrians.
- Slow down on hidden corners.
- Stop for pedestrians when descending steep grades.
- Warn others when passing.
- Don't ride muddy trails.
- Bicyclists are not allowed on all sections of the trails.
- Please observe pedestrian-only trail sections.

DOG OWNERS:

- Keep your dog under control.
- Leash your dog inside the city limits.
- Leash your dog if it chases wildlife or livestock.
- Leash your dog if it is aggressive.
- Clean up after your dog.

HOW YOU CAN HELP:

- Respect private property and don't trespass.
- Pack out your trash.
- Don't spread noxious weeds.
- Report weed infestations.
- Report trail maintenance needs.
- Report safety issues and problems.

ASHLAND WATERSHED TRAIL USE RULES (outside City Limits)

APPROVED ACTIVITIES:

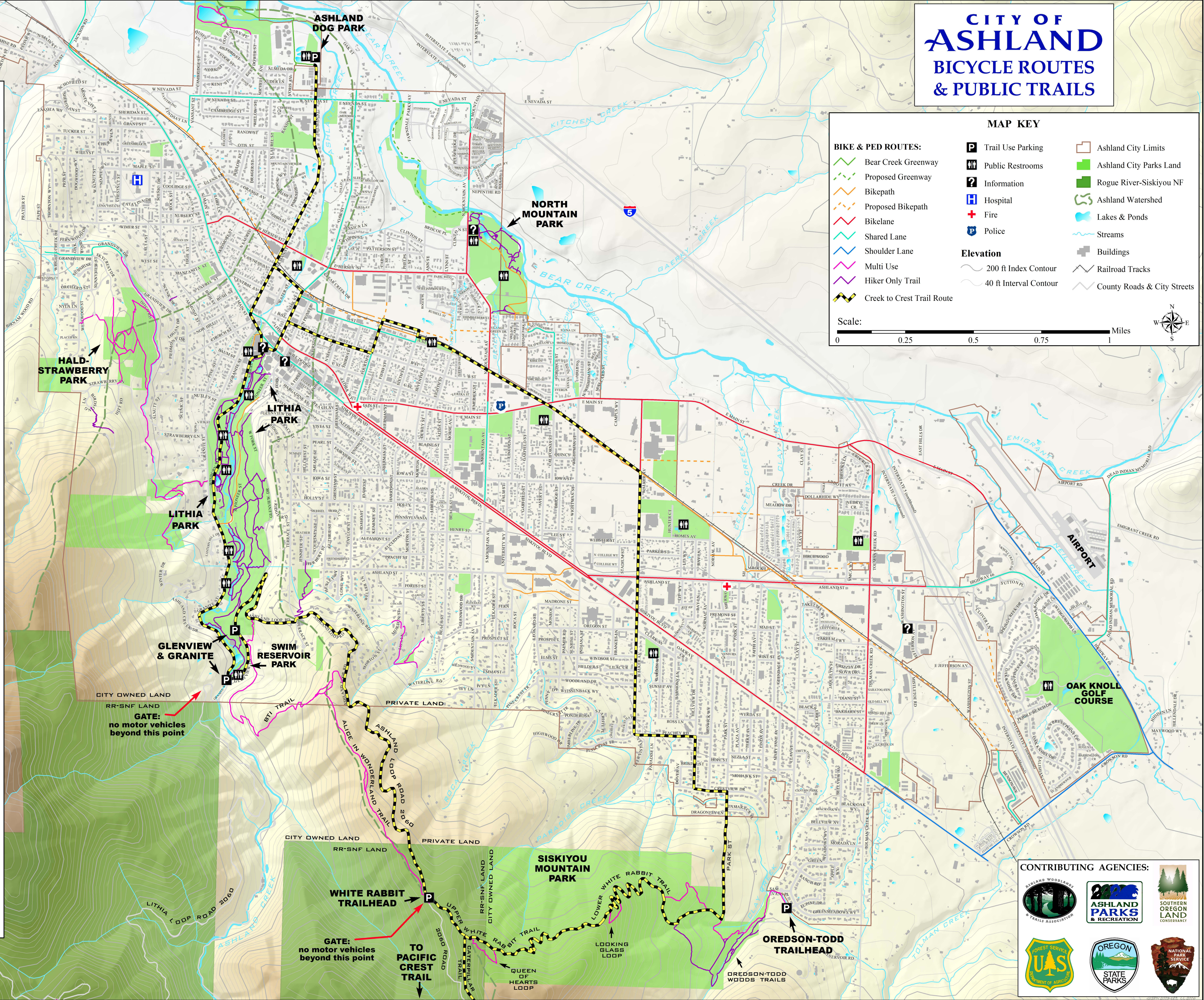
- Hiking Dogs must be kept under control at all times.
- Photography
- Horseback Riding
- Mountain Biking non-motorized, designated trails only
- Hunting in-season, with a license
- Christmas Tree Cutting with a permit

PROHIBITED ACTIVITIES:

- Overnight Camping
- Campfires
- Motorized Vehicles This includes, but is not limited to: snowmobiles, ATV's, motorcycles, 4x4 trucks & autos.
- Blocking Gates with a motor vehicle
- Mountain Biking off designated trails
- Fireworks or Explosive Devices

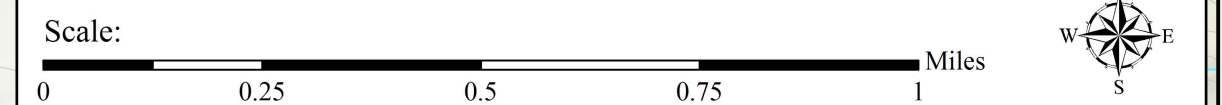
SAFETY WARNING:

In the wildland forest area outside city limits, use caution while enjoying its scenic beauty. Potentially dangerous animals make this area their home (black bears & cougars) and if encountered, should be avoided. Be especially watchful for small children and pets. Roads closed to the public are used by Forest Service and City of Ashland employees and their contractors on a year-round basis. Hikers, bikers, and equestrians should use extreme caution on roads as a vehicle may be encountered at any time.
